COLLECTOR ALERT

On Wednesday, July 9, I was sitting in my office when I received a call on our 800 line. The gentleman asked if I had an ad in a collector magazine and I told him yes. He said he had 8 Mills or Miles machines, he wasn't sure what was the correct pronunciation. He went on to say that he was involved in an estate where the man & wife had recently deceased. His concern was that he had to remove these machines and a number of other things he acquired from the estate. When he said that, I began to think, "This is it!" So, I asked him what other items were involved. He said there was a 9' pool table with inlaid wood and it was very old. He also mentioned there were 3 one armed bandits.

When I asked him what was the difference from the 8 Mills, he replied that they were much larger with the handle in front and made of wood. "Wow," I thought to my self, "uprights!" He said they were about 5' tall. Now, I was beginning to sweat. I continued the conversation and asked him if there were any music machines in this estate. He said, "As a matter of fact, there are!" He described them as big wooden machines that were coin operated.


